- The district may terminate this agreement at any time without cause, and that I am volunteering my services at will and may be asked to discontinue such without prior notice or reason.

## **Hoodsport Trail Park - Volunteer Work Party**

Date: Saturday May 13, 2023

Time: 10am – 2pm

Scope of Work:

- Clear and groom trails
- Hauling & spreading bark
- Staking up small trees

### **Responsibilities:**

- Trimming branches and removing debris from the soft surface trails.
- Moving bark from piles and spreading it in designated areas.
- Tying small trees to long stakes to encourage them to grow strong and straight.

### **Risks:**

Stings, bites, cuts, chemicals, and/or allergens which may cause a serious or life-threatening allergic reaction.
